<u>The Players</u>

- 1. The game shall be played between two teams of no more than three players each.
- 2. A team must have two players present and ready to play by scheduled game time or a forfeit shall be declared. After the game has started,
- 3. A team may play with less than four players after the beginning of the game provided they have an opportunity to win the game.
- 4. Each team is allowed one substitute. Substitutes may enter the game following a made basket, a foul shot, or a stoppage of play.

Equipment

 No one will wear equipment, which is dangerous or confusing to other players or is not appropriate. This includes, but not limited to, such items as: casts, head wear, and jewelry.

General Time Factors

- 1. Playing time shall be two halves of 8 minutes running clock with a oneminute intermission between halves.
- 2. The clock will not be stopped for any purpose other than called time-outs.
- 3. Deliberate stalling or attempts to freeze the ball shall result in loss of ball possession. If a team is warned for stalling, the scorekeeper will administer a 10 second count during which a shot must be attempted. If a shot is not attempted, ball possession is lost.

4. A tie score at the end of regulation time shall, wheneer possible, result in a 2 minute running clock overtime period, with ball possession determined by a coin toss.

Fouls and Penalties

- 1. All common, personal, and technical fouls shall be counted against a team total.
- 2. Individuals cannot foul out of a game, but may be ejected for cause.
- 3. Prior to the fifth team foul:
 - A. Any common foul shall result in loss of possession for the offending team.
 - B. Any offensive fould shall result in disallowing a converted basket
 - C. Any shooting fould with a missed basket shall result in a retained possession.
 - D. Any shooting foul with a converted basket shall result in the basket being awarded and a change of possession.
- 4. On or after the fifth team foul:

B.

- A. Any common foul shall result in a single foul shot along with retained possession for the offended team.
 - Any offensive fould shall result in disallowing a converted basket and a single foul shot along with retained possession for the offended team.
- C. Any shooting fould with a missed basket shall result in two foul shots along with retained possession.
- D. Any shooting foul with a converted basket shall result in the basket being awarded along with retained possession.

Officials

 3 on 3 basketball is self-officiated; however, the scorekeeper or supervisor on duty may penalize any player or team for unsportsmanlike conduct.
